**President's
Message**



Fall is my favorite time of year when the leaves start to change and the air is crisp and cool, the nights cold enough to snuggle under a patchwork quilt. Since I retired, many people have asked me how I am spending my time. The answer to that is quilting. I am following in my mother's footsteps. Mom made some beautiful quilts for the family but also quilted for Lutheran World Relief with the ladies at church. Patchwork quilts are my favorite. Patchwork is a quilt top made beautiful by cutting fabric apart and then re-sewing the pieces back together. There are literally thousands of different fabrics - bright and dull, flowered and plain, so many different ones, just like the women of the church.

The LWML is a patchwork of thousands of women, each beautiful in her own right and joined together by their love of Jesus and a call to serve Him in any way He asks. But, there is room for many more. Besides young women, there are those whose children are preteens or teens, women whose children have grown up and are on their own, women who have retired and are looking for ways to serve, and let's not forget about our women who have served faithfully for many years, but now find themselves unable to drive or stand much or serve in the way they always have. Our challenge is how to involve as many of these women as possible.

Our national LWML President, Jan Wendorf, has identified three target areas for us work on this biennium. I am reviewing them in my rally report and also here so we are all aware of them and can work together toward achieving them.

The first is that each woman of the LCMS would be in the Word daily. This goal starts with each one of us individu-

ally. Pick a quiet time and spend it with your Lord in Bible study or devotion. Use whatever study guide helps you in your study. *Portals of Prayer* is good in particular if you like random reading, but for a more structured reading of the Bible, try the *Today's Light Bible* or the *Today's Light* devotional booklet that comes out every two months from CPH. It leads you through the entire Bible over a two year period (and through the Psalms twice).

The second target involves embracing our diversity - believers joined to one another in spite of differences ranging from age to culture to ethnic background, but at the same time working together in service to God. Try to seek out someone who seems to have different interests than you - you might be surprised how the love of Jesus brings you together.

And the third is making our mission as women of the LWML known to other lay people as well as to pastors. Tell them about our mission focus and ask for their support. Let's do it often and with love and enthusiasm.

God's paintbrush has been busy this fall. The trees change with every passing day. I can really see these changes as I travel to some of your rallies. What a blessing each rally has been to me! Thank you for your warm welcomes and for your prayers. Other travels this fall included a trip to Mission Central in western Iowa along with our national President, past president Mabel plus the past and present district presidents of Iowa West and, attendance at the 2010 retreat hosted by the Dubuque Zone. I have met many of you already and am looking forward to the opportunity to meet many more of you in the future. Do you have concerns or questions? I would love to hear from you. My contact information is inside the front cover of this IDEA. In closing, I ask for your continued prayers for the LWML, for leaders and members alike. Let's keep our focus on the task at hand, serving God and others with gladness.

I pray that each of you has a blessed Christmas season.

Counselor's Corner

Don't Worry... Be Happy!

Words of Jesus from Matthew 6: "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?"

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own" (25-24).

It's Monday, the start of a new work week. Some people love Mondays. They look at them as a time to start fresh and see all the possibilities ahead of them. But for other people, Mondays cause worry. They think about all the things they need to do and how they might not have enough time to do them all.

Which kind of person are you? Do you look forward to the beginning of a new week? Is it a chance to learn new things, catch up with friends, and be of service to those around you? Or do you worry about housework, deadlines, meetings, and how you'll ever be able to keep up?

Jesus tells us not to worry. In the Scripture reading, He tells us to seek first the kingdom of God. God is to be the top priority in our lives.

Jesus says that the birds never worry about where their next meal is coming from. God takes care of them. And if He takes care of them, He will surely take care of us, the children He loves.

Sometimes it's hard not to worry. If your family is having financial problems or someone you love is sick, it might not seem like God is taking care of you, but He is.

God gave us His Word, the Bible, to remind us of His love. And He took care of our most important need: salvation from our sins. He showed us just how much He loves us by sending His Son to die for us and win victory over death.

Try beginning each day by spending time with God. You can pray or read the Bible or do both. Putting God first is the best way to start your day - Monday and every day!

When a group of dedicated women began collecting mites for missions in 1928, they could not have imagined the magnitude of LWML today. When LWML officially began in 1942, it was not possible to contact missionaries around the world via email, they used airmail. Those first women never imagined the computer advancements which allow us to get a mite update simply by going to www.lwml.org and choosing Mission Grants. When those women returned from a rally or convention excited about sharing the Gospel, they would have told the other women in the congregation about the opportunity to serve our Lord through LWML.

When you look around your church on Sunday morning, do you see women who would be interested in being in the Word, of the Word, walking with our Lord? What are you doing about them? Creation Museum Bus Trip, June 13-16, 2011

A bus trip to the Creation Museum in Petersburg, KY is planned for June 13-16, 2011. If you haven't been to the Creation Museum yet, you NEED to go. The museum proclaims "The Authority of the Word of God" and is based on Genesis 1-11. It is truly a walk through the Bible. The museum is located just south of Cincinnati, Ohio and just opened in May 2007. It is a 70,000 square foot facility on 49 acres of beautifully landscaped gardens with walking paths, waterfalls, and bridges. There is also an audio explanation of what you are looking at that you receive through your cell phone.

The museum contains anatomic animals and people. Four theaters, three

restaurants and wonderful displays. Over a million people have been through it.

The bus will leave Monday June 13th from St. John Lutheran Church, 415 4th Ave. SW, Waverly (right on business 218) at 6:30 am. We travel I-380 to I-80 to I-74. We can make pick up points in Waterloo/Cedar Falls, Cedar Rapids, Iowa City and Davenport. We will spend two days in the museum and return home on June 16th.

Ladies, you have continued your recycling work since the June convention. The latest report as of September 25th shows receipts for recyclables, donations and interest of \$14,763.87. This is an increase of \$3082.02 that was reported at convention. On behalf of LWML I thank you for all your time and work to make this fundraiser a success.

I would like to answer two questions that have been asked of me regarding the recyclable items. First, Why are Epsom cartridges not usable for recycle? Answer: The Epsom cartridges are all plastic - there is no metal print head, it is plastic and therefore it cannot be accepted for

recycling. Second, How safe are the items sent in for recycling with regards to cell phones that may still have information on them? Answer: When received for recycling, the recycling company removes all the data on the cell phones (like address books, phone numbers and photos that might have been previously stored on them).

I hope this answers some of your questions. If you have others please let me know.

Hark, the voice of Jesus crying, "Who will go and work today? Fields are white and harvests waiting – Who will bear the sheaves away?" These are the first words from the mission hymn, "Hark, the Voice of Jesus Crying" p. 826 (LSB).

Have you ever thought that maybe YOU are the one who will "Go and work today?" LCMS World Missions has many opportuni-

ties to GO to places like Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Macau, Sri-Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, Kyrgyzstan, Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Uganda, Kenya, Slovakia & more! Some of the WORK done are things like teaching English as a foreign language, sport camps, VBS and children's programs, women's ministry, medical/dental, and construction/repair.

"If you can-not speak like angels, If you

can-not preach like Paul, You can tell the love of Jesus, You can say he died for all.” (ss. 2, Hark, the voice of Jesus Crying) That is true for each and everyone as Christians. We might not speak like angels, but we don’t have to. We just have to be willing to speak.

Do you have a passion to use your God-given gifts to His glory? Do you have anywhere from one week up to six months? Do you enjoy serving others? Are you able to walk distances, climb stairs and tolerate some heat? Then let’s GO!

I plan to be leading an LWML-IDE team on a 10-day trip to Cambodia in July 2011. We will hold quilt making workshops. (Sewing experience is NOT required, just a desire to GO!) The workshops will be to make quilted banners and share with the Cambodian ladies God’s Word through Bible study and fellowship. Translators will be provided. Spouses and friends who are not LWML members are welcome to join our team. All you need to bring is your smiles, hugs, and the desire to serve! I can take a team of up to 15 people. The cost of the trip is approximately \$800 per person (which includes, food, lodging, medical insurance, etc), plus airfare (approx. \$1,500). You also must have a valid US passport for travel.

“With your prayers and your bounties you can do what commands; You can be like faithful Aaron, holding up the prophets hands.” (ss. 3, Hark the voice of Jesus Crying) If you can’t GO you can still help and here’s how.

PRAY for all the missionaries and their work around the world. PRAY that the Lord of the harvest will call and send His people to seek out the lost and bring the life-saving message of the Gospel of forgiveness and salvation of Jesus Christ.
